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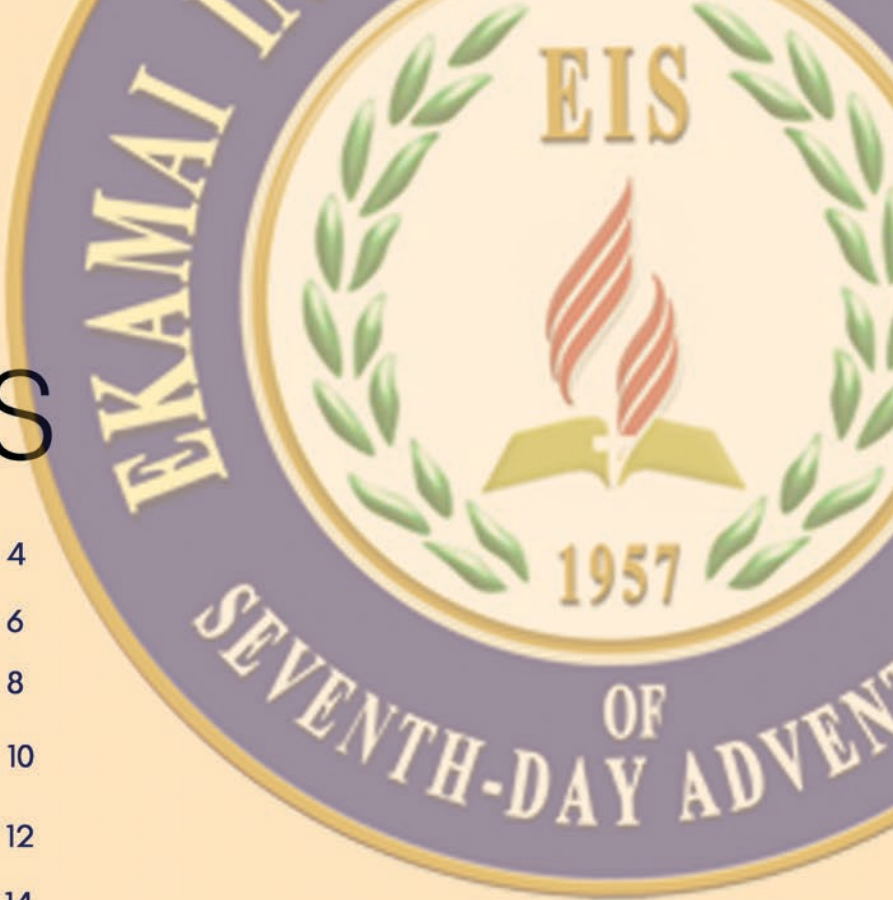

Ekamai International School recently renovated and expanded building four into a 3,957 square meters 6-storey building with a cafeteria and classrooms. The dining areas feature large tables and chairs, which separate the kitchen from the serving areas.

Challenge: The administrators wanted the school cafeteria to serve 1,400 students and function as a classroom for the rising population of the school that empowers, inspires, and serves situated at Ekamai area. It was a challenge as we needed to consider a lot of things during the construction as the noise, dust, and the daily operation may disrupt the teachers teaching and the students learning. But during the lockdown, there were not many people on the campus. However, there came also a time when the construction was halted due to government restrictions.

Solution: After careful consideration, the School Board approved the Construction Committee members who painstakingly in full process and have

chosen Choknaenna Thailand to be the general contractor that will manage the smooth day-to-day operation. The building has a total floor plan of 3,957 square meters with a height of 23 meters. The 1st and 2nd floors serve as cooking and eating areas.

The 3rd, 4th, 5th, and 6th floors will be used as classrooms with a total capacity of twenty five students per room installed with a state of the art teaching technology.

After more than one year of working despite the COVID-19 situation, the new cafeteria building is now open to serve students, teachers, and staff for more convenience. The updated space will help students over two lunch periods.



Additionally, the kitchen will support outsourced booths and a new menu focused on healthier, international food choices.

We thank all of you for your constant prayers. Every worker's safety and cooperation in this great building project is truly an answered prayer.

SURVEY REVEALED FOOD PREFERENCES ON CAMPUS

Most of the parents and teachers are gearing towards the road to healthy Ekamai International School and its management are in one way or another providing the best palatable food in the campus. Not sold out to many, but our food service department always cook palatable menus for everyone. Have you missed our food, snacks and beverages?

Over the years, you may have heard someone say, "the food is oily", "why so salty?" and many more. Our staff try to balance each of our concerns and it is important for us to pass the quality food assurance that the government has required. Alas! We did!

The Bangkok Post published on October 20, 2020 that Thai parents have voiced concerns both online and offline over the quality and quantity of food served to their children during school lunch. Would you agree? Based on the online survey we had with Grade 9 students in November 2021, majority is missing the beef noodles served in our cafeteria, followed by chicken noodles, then khao soy in our noodle booth.

For other options, more than half of the respondents ranked fried chicken first, with chicken curry and beef curry as second and third respectively.

The students who joined the survey were majority boys. One student commented, "I'm not sure if there's going to be some new food in the new cafeteria, but I think I'll probably go for one of the rice and fried chicken or maybe fried fish, since it's one of my favorite menus there." During the school opening, many of the students would try the famous lemonade. With the 4% of the students voted no, 36% said maybe, 60% of our freshmen were excited to see and dine in the new school cafeteria.

"The new building has been in construction for over a year, so I'm really looking forward to seeing both the new building and the cafeteria. It has never been changed for a long time, so I really want to see what adjustments have been made. Thanks for the past services," one student shared.



Thank you dear students for your participation in the survey conducted in the Values classes of Mr. Romualdo Dalo Jr. We have noted your suggestions and will share to the concerned administrators for proper action. 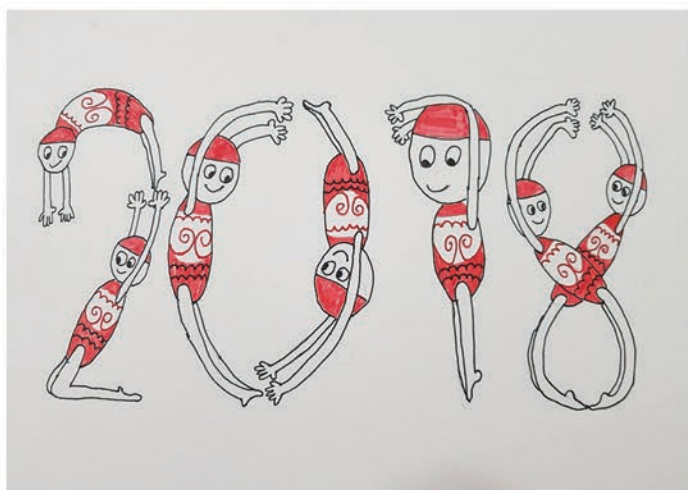
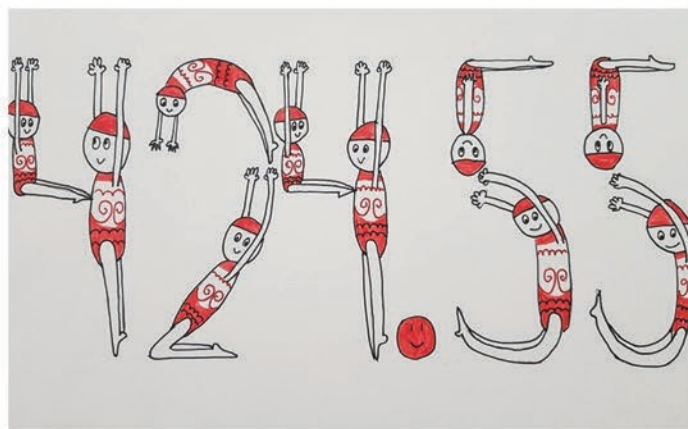
Another member of the Ekamai International School family has again brought home honor by bagging the second runner-up prize during the Chinese Speech Competition recently attended by other international schools in Thailand.

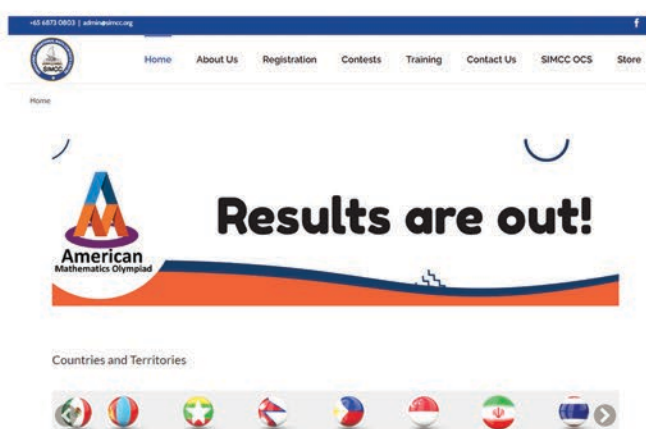
VYAAN RAJU AWARDED HONORABLE MENTION IN AMERICAN MATHEMATICS OLYMPIAD

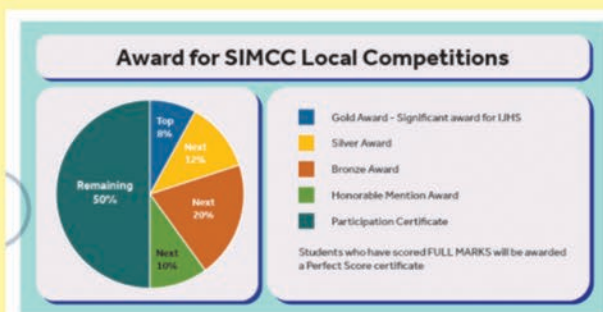

Bamboo School is a refuge for children who have medical issues, are orphans, or are abandoned, ranging from one to fifteen years old. This is not only a learning center but a haven where kids are trained to find their value and purpose in life so they can, in return, serve others.

"God can use little kids with big hearts. Let me share with you how this is manifested. Recently, someone came to visit our campus. There were three buses with donations, and everybody was busy unloading when one of my toddlers carried a small bottle with water and offered it to the three drivers. That was the greatest moment for us. Not caring about the danger of Covid with the water sharing, his purpose was to help these drivers quench their thirst, and in his minimal wisdom, this was his way of serving," a proud and beaming Ms. Riley-Bryan shared.

In the classroom, the teacher is the standard light-bearer. A teacher diligently develops and nurtures a close relationship with Christ, solely depends and quests for God's wisdom and guidance. Whatever subject or lesson teachers teach, they are ready to implement a

reform because they carefully choose and align the curriculum for teaching based on their belief and adherence to the school's mission. White points out that "it may seem that the teaching of God's word has but little effect on the minds and hearts of many students; but, if the teacher's works have been wrought in God, some lessons of divine truth will linger in the memory of the most careless. The Holy Spirit will water the seed sown, and often it will spring up after many days and bear fruit to the glory of God". Testimonies vol 5,p26.2

Results are generally not immediate. Let's profitably spend time. Have our eyes on the long run; we will finish with each student or colleague even years after the school year. Be reminded of how Apostle Paul encouraged, "I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God has been making it grow" 1 Corinthians 3: 6. Spiritual gifts and opportunities are bestowed on us. Burdens are borne, labor is done. In the hereafter, the action and reaction will be seen. Never lose heart because failure to do as expected of us is a wasted life!

LEARNING DURING STRESSFUL SITUATIONS

They are held hostage in the room where they once longed to spend time now view it as a confine. They are forced to sit and stare at a screen and are asked to talk into a microphone. They do not wish to speak but are forced to participate in a question and answer session; however, they cannot articulate their true feelings.

Many students are suffering from psychological, mental, and emotional issues. They have happily put their lives into the reverse gear and are quickly spiraling out of control. This has impacted their learning rather negatively. Some of my students wrote these thoughts in their journals.

"We are alone," "I feel trapped," "I am overwhelmed," "I cannot sleep, so I play games," "My parents are always fighting, and I have control; I feel helpless," to name a few of the problems. These are seniors who are quickly spiraling in the opposite direction. These students are filled with the helplessness that they are not prepared for. They are locked in the tower of loneliness and desolation.

Taking to heart the advice shared by Justice & Espinoza (2007), who says that it is better to lend a helping hand now to the students struggling emotionally,

It has been wisely said that "stress acts as an accelerator: it will push you either forward or backward, but you choose which direction" Chelsea Eriean. As the pandemic shows no sign of abating, it is taking a toll on the home and the classroom students. Students of all ages are struggling at all levels. The time these students looked forward to using the computers to only play games and the joy it brought is now the albatross around their neck as they have become virtual prisoners in front of their screens.

physically, and psychologically rather than wait for them to look for help online. They encourage the teachers to equip the student with a useful skill set, which is finding the correct information and understanding it. This, in turn, will enable students to improve their academic performance and become more empathetic and caring students. This theme of developing self-awareness by teaching them to understand and block out the jargon and not to be overwhelmed by the information is a self-awareness skill set. The students need to be taught the ability to

know that this is a problem not created by them, but the pandemic, that is, to be objective, not overwhelmed. They should be taught not to hide but to deal with their problems head-on, making resilient and emotionally strong students.

Teachers who build empathic skills, along with scaffolding the students to learn from the practicality of each of the subjects, will only "comfort" the students. It will help and reassure the adolescents, and any struggling child will be empowered to take the time to make informed decisions that will stand them in good stead along the path of life. This, in return, will make them into strong leaders. When this school, like the others, was placed online as the pandemic encircled and ensnared the students and their families collectively into the web of fear and it led them by the nose into the concealed trap of fear. With a lot of information available at everyone's fingertips, it is easy to get lost in the maze of misinformation fact vs. fiction and vice versa.

As parents, who have to deal with the reality of working from home, now a fact that was once a dream, they had to take on other responsibilities rather unexpectedly and wear many more hats as the world shuts down rather abruptly? The tiny virus which has held the world hostage for approximately two years has brought us to our knees and to a new way of thinking. As the world was previously locked up in the prison of fear, it seems to be losing its hold ever so slightly.

As the students were stuck in front of the computers, they all had to learn how to deal with the new normal of having their class from home. Some played truant as they were overwhelmed, and others were just so fearful of trying that they just gave up. All of this leads to stress and when the students are struggling academically yet effectively. The abruptness of the shutdown caused them to feel abandoned and alone. Engulfed with fear and negative thoughts of helplessness, fear of failure led to doing nothing. This tiny virus had unhinged the world at its core. The students and parents were most unprepared.

At EIS, the teachers acknowledged that though there was a need to finish the curriculum, it was more humanitarian to reach out to the students and their parents. The teachers buckled down, and they doubled their efforts to build bridges and learn and empower all who asked for help. They helped students and parents alike reframe their perspective or look at a situation from a different perspective. This is a well-known emotional regulation technique that has been used to manage negative thoughts and their outcomes and difficult emotions. (Gross, 1998). Reframing creates a distance between the problem and the person suffering and thus feels less overwhelming. This technique can bring about healthier emotions and, consequently, more adaptive behaviors.

As teachers changed professions to become researchers, they took to heart the advice given by Ladson-Billings (1992), who has said that effective teachers who use the local culture as the basis of teaching to reach more students and yet still complete the curriculum, as they adapted it to the students' learning. Teachers at EIS are doing their best to teach students the subjects and connect their issues to today's problems. They are working to make sure that they can reduce the stress and ensure that EIS, Empowers, Inspires, and Serves everyone in the community.

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Scientists and doctors are given the highest regard by many but teaching has been considered the noblest profession. Teachers are selfless, have a heart full of patience and understanding. It takes courage and passion for spreading knowledge, sharing wisdom, and nurturing each student to become responsible citizens. Some other professionals later find themselves engaged in the teaching profession despite their successful careers. But there is also a throng of teachers who gave up because of the many challenges they faced every day at work.

Though I am not assigned to teaching this year, I was drawn to read Annette Breaux and Todd Whitaker's "Quick Answers for Busy Teachers; Solutions to 60 Common Challenges". Annette is Louisiana's informative and entertaining speaker, teacher, and curriculum coordinator. Dr. Todd was a Math teacher and basketball coach in Missouri and recognized as a leading presenter in education in Indiana.



As I read on the challenges, memories of my teaching days flashed back, especially my very challenging first school year in EIS. Every year is a different experience, but we all have our highs and lows. We have other ways to address every challenge we face in the classroom or the school community. With permission from Dr. Todd, please read the following excerpts hoping you can draw great insights from.

A STUDENT IS REFUSING TO DO WORK

Try to determine the reason. If a student is overwhelmed and does not understand, provide remediation instead of scolding.

If the student is struggling with either at-home or school issues, listen. Help him or seek help from experts if necessary. Ensure that the student knows you care and willing to help. Don't ever allow to engage in a power struggle. The better approach is to act out of concern, not frustration.

YOU LOST YOUR TEMPER WITH YOUR STUDENTS

To err is human but realize that it's never appropriate to lose temper with students. Regain your composure. Catch yourself in the act. Try to speak calmly and rationally as you address the issue. Apologize. It does not make you appear weak but rather strong to take responsibility for your action. Students will learn from you doing it. Explain the 'why' but not justify your inappropriate reaction.

YOU DISAGREE WITH YOUR ADMINISTRATOR

It is okay for professionals to disagree with the administrators. But true professionals act professionally, not argumentatively, superiorly, and or publicly. State your case with reasons, data, and, most importantly, solutions. Never bad-mouth your administrator to other co-workers. It will only serve to make you appear bitter and unprofessional. Some people might lose respect for you.



You may not always get the results you want, but you'll be able to respect yourself for handling the situation maturely, honestly, and responsibly.

YOUR CLASSROOM NEEDS A MAKEOVER BUT YOU'RE JUST NOT A DECORATOR

Is your classroom suffering from a case of the blahs? Does it lack color, organization, or style? Does it feel cozy and welcoming, or does it feel cold? Try Google, Pinterest, and many websites that will undoubtedly give you tons of ideas on what to do for each of your needs. Have your students help you. To add interest, use their work- projects, worksheets, their creations. This step will motivate them to do their best. By enlisting support from students or co-workers, your classroom can experience an amazing transformation in no time at all.

YOU'RE OVERWHELMED BY NEW TECHNOLOGY

There's no arguing that technology is beginning to change the way we teach and how our students learn. Sometimes we find ourselves being overwhelmed with how fast technology advances. We haven't fully mastered an app yet, and in a month or two, it has become obsolete, and a better one has already come to replace it. Relax. You can't possibly be up-to-date on all the latest advancements. No one can. But as long as you are moving forward and continually learning something new. Foremost, find out what the school expects of you. Learn to do what is expected. It is vital to keep abreast of certain things or technology that affect teaching and learning. Strive to do better than stay being mediocre.

Teaching may not be easy, but its rewards far outweigh its challenges. As a teacher, remember that you are a powerful, influential person because, with God's help, you touch lives as you interact with your students and their parents as well as with your colleagues and administrators.
