Book Fair

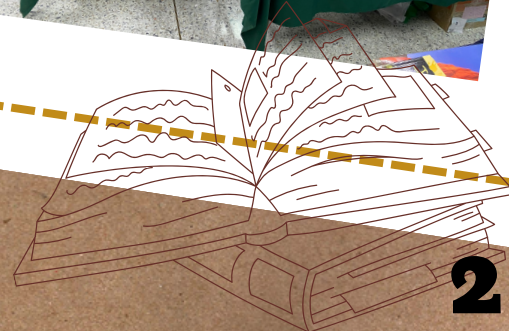

Meet Two of Middle School's Awarded Talents!

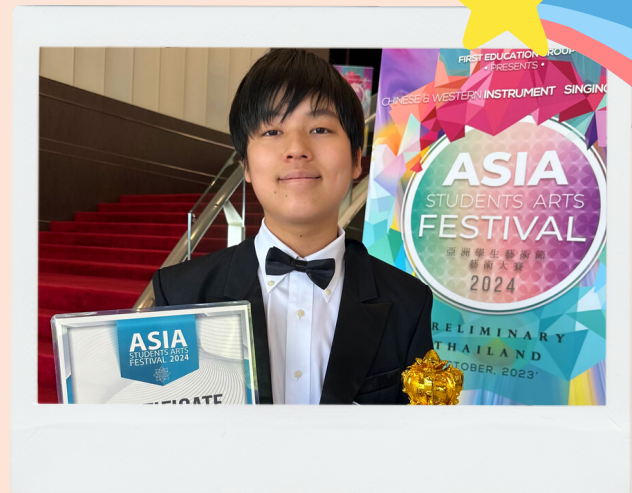


Q: How long have you been playing piano for?

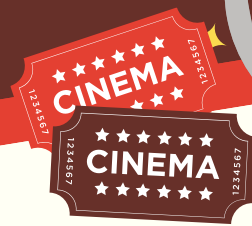
Q: Is it challenging to balance being an athlete as well as a student?

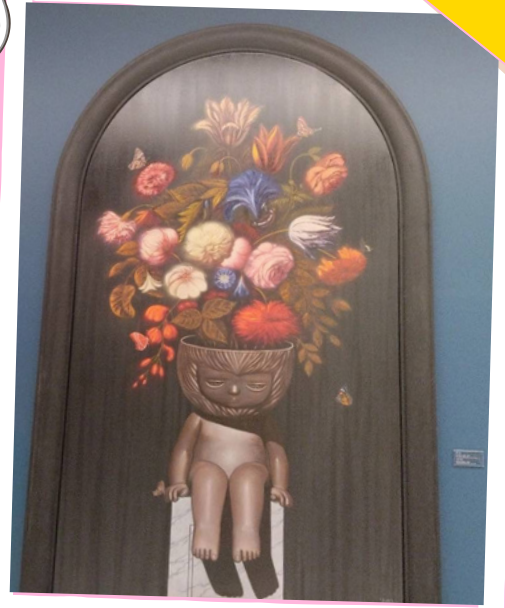
